Dear Parishioners of Saint Polycarp,

In *Crossing the Threshold of Hope*, Vittorio Messori edited the written responses of Pope John Paul II, who is now Saint Pope John Paul II, as the Church prepared to cross the third millennium or the year 2000. In one of the chapters, Messori claimed that the Church is silent about what is most essential: *eternal life*. Thus, he presented the Pope this question: "Your Holiness, do heaven, purgatory, and hell still exist? Why do many Churchmen comment interminably upon topical issues, but hardly ever speak to us about eternity, about that ultimate union with God that, as faith teaches, remains man's vocation, man's destiny, and ultimate death?" (p. 178).

To reply to Messori's question, the Pope said, "Let's remember that not so long ago, in sermons during retreats or missions, the *Last Things*—death, judgment, heaven, hell, and purgatory—were always a standard part of the program of mediation and preachers knew how to speak of them in an effective and evocative way. How many people were drawn to conversion and confession by these sermons and reflections on the Last Things! Furthermore, we have to recognize that this pastoral style was *profoundly personal*: 'Remember that at the end you will present yourself before God with your entire life' (*ibid*, p. 179). The Pope continued, "Man is free and therefore *responsible*. His is a personal and social responsibility, a responsibility before God, a responsibility which is his greatness" (*ibid*, p. 180).

As we attend church this weekend, we hear a similar question in the Gospel, in which a scholar of the law approached Jesus and asked Him: "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" (*Lk* 10:25). Responding to this question, Jesus initially challenged the scholar of the law to fulfill the obligations of the Torah or the Laws. The scholar of the law was able to recite the Torah's obligations. That is, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" (*Deut* 6:5).

However, reciting or knowing the law does not necessarily mean that eternal life is warranted. To Jesus, the inheritance of eternal life goes beyond the holding onto of one's religious legalistic view or the serving one's circle of friends. To further one's capacity to inherit eternal life, Jesus presents the beautiful story of the *Samaritan Man*. In this story, the priest stands for those who strictly observing the external values of the law; the Samaritan man stands for those who venture beyond the law and to embrace radical differences to love the man who was robbed.

The story of the *Samaritan Man* can be applied to all of us—that is, we are called to embrace others, despite our differences. The attitude of the priest, who worried only in observing the external precepts of the laws, is not a standard for inheriting eternal life. Remember, the evil act of the robber in the story is never accepted anywhere. Remember also that the Church condemns sins or sinful acts, but always embraces the person. Look at story of the woman who was caught in adultery. Her sins were condemned, but her dignity was restored: go home and sin no more!

In saying that "Man is free and therefore responsible," the Pope wants us to understand that each one of us is responsible to ourselves, to society, and to God. The Christian tenet on eternal life is based on charity or *caritas*, which means love. This *caritas* is God: *Deus caritas est* (*1 Jn* 4:7-8).

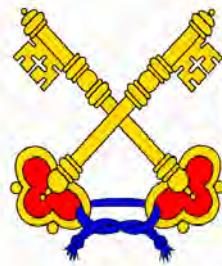

NOTICE TO THE BUSINESSES & RESIDENTS OF STANTON

The City of Stanton has contracted All American Asphalt for the FY 2021-2022 Citywide Street Resurfacing Project. This project consists of asphalt paving or slurry seal work, and concrete removals and replacements in select areas.

This work will start on July 13th and last approximately 18 weeks.

Normal working hours will be between the hours of about 8:30 AM and 4:30 PM Monday through Friday.

Access to all businesses will remain open during construction operations but will be limited at times.

There will be "No Parking Signs" posted on your street indicating the specific dates work will be performed on the street 72 hours prior to start. During the time we are working, access to through traffic may be limited, and business / residential traffic may also be affected. During working hours we ask the following:

1. Please assist us by not parking your vehicles in the roadway when posted
2. Please assist us by not allowing water to run on the roadway
3. Please assist us by not placing trash cans or other debris in the roadway.

A City inspector will be overseeing the construction process and will be working directly with the contractor to minimize impact to you. Your patience and cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Ya sea alguien que necesita atención, un error que debe ser rectificado, una injusticia que debe abordarse o alguien que necesita ayuda, el lente a través del cual vemos la vida (e incluso las reglas por las que vivimos) pueden impedirnos parar y actuar. Ya sea por la obsesión por llegar a tiempo, la compulsión por completar las tareas de acuerdo con un cronograma, la rigidez por no infringir una ley o el miedo a correr riesgos, perdemos oportunidades diarias de mostrar misericordia. A menudo fallamos en nuestro deber de ser un buen prójimo, especialmente cuando se trata de hermanos y hermanas alejados de nosotros a quienes nunca hemos conocido. El dolor del mundo es nuestro dolor. La ley de amor, misericordia y compasión de Dios no es algo remoto. Ya está dentro de nosotros y muy cerca. Todo lo que tenemos que hacer es abrir los ojos y llevarlo a cabo.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO - ALENTAR ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

10 de julio de 2022

15º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Así es, Dios nunca nos pide algo que no podamos hacer. Nuestras manos y corazón están a la medida de lo que se debe de hacer. Aunque, a veces se sienta que no se puede pasar por la experiencia que se vive, Dios da la fuerza y se avanza, muchas veces arriesgando la propia vida. En la primera lectura de este domingo, Dios alienta al pueblo en su travesía por el desierto de la siguiente manera: *“Todo lo contrario, mi palabra ha llegado bien cerca de ti; ya la tienes en la boca y sabes de memoria, y solo hace falta ponerla en práctica” (Deuteronomio 30,14)*; asegurando su cercanía y poniendo en práctica su fe y confianza de lo aprendido de su misma experiencia del camino.

El Papa Francisco, en una de sus tantas catequesis dominicales, nos pide asegurarnos de preguntarnos lo siguiente: *¿Nuestra fe es fecunda? ¿Nuestra fe produce obras buenas? ¿O es más bien estéril, y, por tanto, está más muerta que viva? ¿Me hago prójimo o simplemente paso de largo?* La última pregunta de este perfecto examen de conciencia de este domingo del buen samaritano es la siguiente: *¿Soy de aquellos que seleccionan a la gente según su propio gusto?* Y, es más, el Papa Francisco recomienda que estas preguntas nos las hagamos frecuentemente, no una vez al día, sino varias veces en la jornada del día. El buen samaritano y el posadero son los ejemplos de este Evangelio. ¿Cuál deseas imitar tú?

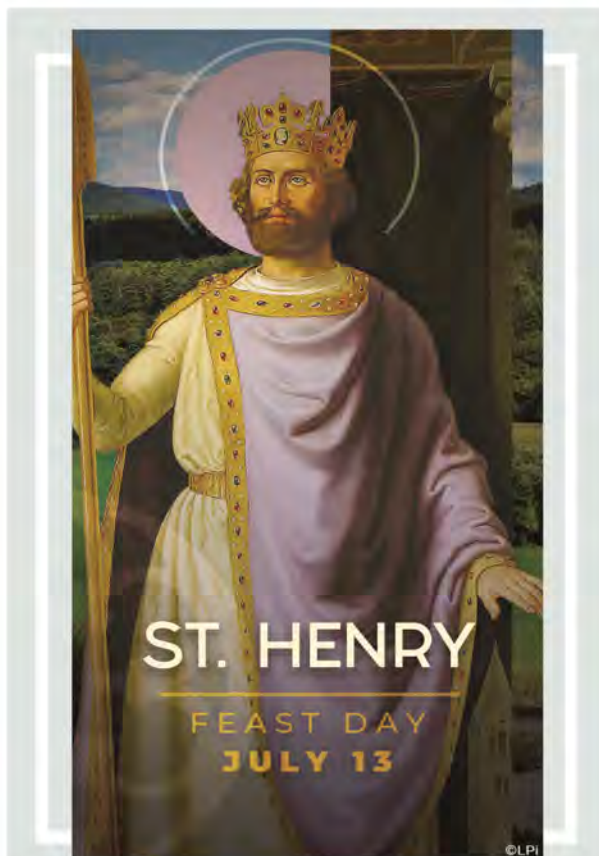

Saint of the Week

Saint Henry was born in 972 to Henry, Duke of Bavaria, Germany, and his wife Gisela of Burgundy. Saint Henry's early life was permeated with Christianity, among those who guided his education was Bishop Wolfgang of Ratisbon, who became a saint himself. In 995, Saint Henry succeeded his father as Duke of Bavaria, and in 1002, upon the death of his cousin, Otho III, he was elected emperor. In 1014, Saint Henry undertook the long journey from Germany to Rome to be crowned Holy Roman Emperor by Pope Benedict XIII.

In 1022 Saint Henry assisted Pope Benedict VIII in holding the Council of Pavia, which promoted clerical celibacy and sought to end simony (the buying and selling of ecclesiastical goods and offices). During his reign, Saint Henry used his wealth and position for the Church. He confirmed Benedict's authority over Rome, was a patron of churches and monasteries, supported the Cluniac Reforms, restored episcopal sees, and founded the Diocese of Bamberg where he built a cathedral. Saint Henry was married to Cunigunde of Luxembourg, to whom he was incredibly devoted. Although disputed by some historians, some stories of the couple's marriage report they took vows of chastity because their union was childless. Saint Henry died in July of 1024 and was canonized in 1146 by Pope Eugene III.

WHAT JESUS DOESN'T SAY

"If Jesus wanted us to (fill in the blank), he would have said so."

We hear this argument applied to every controversial topic under the sun — and even some not-so-controversial topics, too. Whenever someone is trying to make a case for a decision they have already made, they call in Jesus' scriptural silence on the matter as their expert, unimpeachable witness.

And sure, there's much Jesus doesn't talk about in the Gospels. But by this logic, we would have to assume that Jesus doesn't care, for instance, if we drive well over the speed limit (he doesn't discuss cars and highways in the Bible) or what we do online (he never mentions the Internet or websites at all!), when we know that certainly is just not the case.

Like the scholar of the Jewish law who challenges Jesus to define who exactly his "neighbor" is, we can argue semantics all we want. But if we rest in prayer and look deep into our hearts, we know what path we need to take, and it's usually not the easy one.

I find that I do this plenty in ways that are far more subtle. I lament that the situation facing me is not sufficiently "black and white." I become frustrated by the shades of moral grey and toss up my hands, claiming I don't know what the right answer is, insisting that I can't be blamed for the ramifications of whatever decision I make.

What I need to be doing in these situations is asking God for His guidance, even if it makes me nervous. I need to be like the scholar. He was brave enough to ask, even though I think he knew he wouldn't particularly like the answer. Let's strive for that same courage.

What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content

of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?
